The Regional Training Hub officially welcomed our interns with a meet and greet event and they have all been partnered with a mentor to guide them through their first year out and establish links with the Fraser Coast.

Finally, for those that have managed to secure time for their own education, the Rural Doctor's Association of Queensland conference is planned for June in Gladstone. RDAQ has an established history of rural doctor advocacy, and we have colleagues representing our region.
